

Our guest speaker, **Susan Gesundheit**, has a passion for printmaking and makes monotypes and chine colle on her press in Ventura. The process of manipulating cut shapes and printing layers feels akin to making collage.



Susan's first collage relief of the Guggenheim Museum was done at age 10 circa 1962.

A workshop by Wayne Hoffman illuminated the possibilities of making her own papers for collage. The procion dyes were non-fading powder used to make a liquid. Supervision was recommended for less experienced dyemakers.



The 24" x 24" monotype URBANE was made with cut templates of plastic dropcloth. The artist was inspired by textures left behind when the pieces were pulled off. Second and third generation ghost prints were also used to produce this monotype.



MUSTANG MONEY PLANT, monotype 12×18 Two favorite themes are the Lunaria plant and the horse.



VILLAGE CON-FUSION with ironed-on fused fabric 16" x 20"



A project for FLASHPOINTS: A Collective Response at the 2017 Jerusalem Bienniale was based on a three-part exquisite corpse format. Susan teamed with Jackie Nach and Debra Sokolow for this mixed media piece on sewn canvas.

SUSAN GESUNDHEIT'S PRINTMAKING SEQUENCE



1. The plate is inked with a roller.



2. Two inked templates are placed on top of the plate as well as a hard-to-see shape cut from screen. The artist recommends the hardware store as a source of materials.




4. The plate (see #2) is re-used. Some ink remains, and a chine-colle element (typically a printed piece of paper) is placed face down on the plate, with adhesive on its backside. The piece with three rectangles was moved from its previous position.



5. The ghost print from the re-used plate. The chine-colle piece was glued to the printmaking paper and its frontside picture is revealed to us.

3. The first print with the three items, which take the ink and print very differently. The screen item shows up very light in front



There was a tour by Christy S. Wood at LeMieux Galleries https://www.lemieuxgalleries.com/ in New Orleans which featured mixed media work. There were many virtual artist interviews, one featuring women collagists and another imagining a trial TV Q & A show. I didn't attend this one, but some CAA readers may like the idea of the Cat and Paste Workshop: Cats, Art History, & Collage. Kolaj Magazine is promoting collage networks around the world and has assembled serious unique participants mostly in the 30-55 age range. One of the most common techniques was classic--cutting and pasting printed paper and gluing with wheat paste, on traditional substrates but also on outdoor surfaces. The artists' visions and surprises were compelling.


A particularly challenging session, "The Future of Collage," featured a conversation between the Weird Show's Max-o-matic and Ric Kasini Kadour of Kolaj Magazine. Much was said, here is some:

When discussing "What is Collage" the most essential concept is context, like the transformation of meaning by changing context in which the element is displayed. By that definition, and possibly stretching the point, Max-o-matic feels that Warhol soup cans are collage because they were recontextualized.

Because collage is an exceptionally accessible medium and a gateway to making art, another essential question is "What is a good collage?" There is the technical and aesthetic aspect versus collage as a mindset, which the panelists consider to be a more advanced level of practice.

Much of current collage is made as it was 100 years ago, when the liberation of materials was new. Right now there is a lot of digital work which reflects current technology. What might collage become in the future?

The underrepresentation of collagists in galleries may be related to the stigma attached to a very accessible artform. However, there seems to be more collage in the largest venues lately, although the term "mixed media" seems to have more cache. As the art world opens more to people of color, there may also be more visibility for collage. Also, efforts to broaden the art market provide a way to include an art form as essentially democratic and reasonably priced as collage.




