Maximum size for wall-hung work is 36" in any direction including frame.

3-D pieces must fit on a 12" x 12" pedestal.

Maximum weight is 30 lbs for wall hung pieces and 45 lbs for 3-D pieces.

Diptychs, triptychs, and other multipart artwork must be presented as a single work at take-in, with all parts attached and ready to hang as a single piece, within the maximum of 36" in any direction.

IMPORTANT CALL FOR NOMINATIONS FOR PRESIDENT AND FIRST VICE PRESIDENT-EXHIBITS

Sherrill Kahn had to resign as CAA President in March 2017. The First Vice President-Exhibits position has been open since July 1 2016. Nominations for both of these critically important offices are now being solicited for a special election to be held next month.

Per CAA Bylaws, if the President leaves office, the Presidency is assumed by the 1st VP. If she is unable the 2nd VP assumes the office, then if she is unable, the 3rd VP steps up. In CAA's current situation, the 1st VP position has been vacant since the start of the fiscal year, and the current 2nd and 3rd VPs have declined the Presidency. Therefore, a Special Election must be held to fill the office of President. The nomination period is now open and nominations will be fielded from the membership.

Per CAA Bylaws, candidates for President must have previously been a member of the CAA Board of Directors or have comparable experience.

Please send nominations for both President and First Vice President-Exhibits (two offices) by MAY 1 to Marian Devney. Email m.devney@yahoo.com or snail mail 926 La Rambla Dr, Burbank CA 91501. A ballot of nominees will follow, with instructions, and will be sent to members. Votes will be tallied, and an announcement will be made. After the nomination deadline, further instructions will be sent.

FRANK WHIPPLE

MARCH 24TH MEETING

Frank Whipple III has created small poetic collaged fantasies for over 20 years. At the March 24th meeting, he discussed his various approaches to making his artworks.

A collector of ephemera, his strongest influences are pop culture, high-end modern design, comics, pulp magazine covers, space age, and antique mechanical engravings. The artist is a native of Los Angeles, from a family of creatives; old movies and television are a frequent inspiration. Many of his works are essentially illustrations of stories that he constructs during his collage making. He loves wordplay in his titles, visual puns, and goofiness.

One of Mr. Whipple's methods is to see faces, often approximations of faces, in magazine pictures, then using them in collage. Sometimes he conjures aliens and monsters. He pointed out that flipping an image upside down leads to finding more information, things not noticed previously. Flipping is a way to get out of a creative rut.

The artist has often made attempts, some motivated by peer pressure, to veer from his natural tendency toward complex representational surrealism into abstraction, geometry, and simplification.

He cuts up found images (and sometimes uses scans/photocopies) and stores them, so that he can play with them later for his minimally-planned intuitive pieces. He uses an acid-free variation of Elmer's glue and eschews fixative due to loss of control.

Most recently, Mr. Whipple has made small totem images from mechanical illustrations and has collaged over and transformed cabinet card photographs. These were on display for CAA and showed a sense of wonder, intricacy, and finessed proportion.
